BIRD NOTES:

Pyrrhuloxia - a male appeared in the yard of the George Ross' at 2805 S. Travis on Jan, 23. The bird was seen againm on the 24th and 25th by a number of birders. This is the first confirmed sighting of this species in the Panhandle.

Northern Shrike - an immature bird at the first water crossing the Palo Duro Canyon State Park was seen on Jan. 30 by Ken Seyffert. The bird was observed as it chased a male cardinal for five minutes or longer. It was unsuccessful in catching its intended prey: in fact, it was never seen to even strike the bird. It always drew back at the last moment as though it was uncertain that it should carry its attack home. Prior to the shrike's launching its initial attack, all the birds in the area became silent. Another male cardinal perched in an exposed position a few yards in front of the observer became perfectly still and did not ruffle a feather until the other cardinal was attacked, at which time it dove quickly into the brush as did other small birds in the area.

EAGLES - eleven were seen at Buffalo Lake NWR on Jan. 16 by Ken Seyffert, 8 immature and 1 adult Bald Eagles, and 2 immature Golden Eagles. Most of the birds were sitting on the ice or perched in the trees and several were feeding on dead ducks. On Feb. 6 Maurine and Joed Forbus saw 15 Bald Eagles in Bugby Canyon.

Merlin - Maurine Forbus observed one in her back yard in Borger on Feb. 5. The bird was perched for some time as it fed on a dead

Horned Grebe - one seen in Harbor Bay by Fern Cain on Jan. 29.

SOME STATISTICS GLEANED FROM OUR STAR BIRDER: Rena Ross finally took some time off from birding to tote up the numbers she has so far seen. On her World List she has 1458 species: for North America 618; for Mexico 514; for Texas 455. Last year was her most productive when she observed 464 different species. As a matter of comparison, and to show how far she has yet to go before she has seen them all, there are about 8600 species of birds in the world (those who have issued World Lists disagree on the total), 804 on the ABA list for North America, and about 530 for Texas. It is interesting to point out that of the 530 species to be seen in Texas, 355 have been observed in Potter/Randall Counties. This is not bad for the treeless high plains which the uneducated layman considers devoid of birdlife, or of hardly anything else.
