March 16: Turkey Vulture - northeast Panhandle (Vera Doason, Estelle Duncan, Mayy Moyer, Rena Ross, Esther Waddill). Eastern Phoobe(2) - in McBride Canyon, Potter Co. (Fern Cain)

March 23: Cinnamon Teal(1); Long-billed Curlew(16); Lesser Yellowlegs(1); Least Sandpiper(2); Long-billed Dowitcher (78); American Avocet(30); Barn Owl (1); Troc Swallow(2); Western Bluebird(5); Swamp Sparrow(1) - all at Buffalo Lake NWR (Ken Seyffert).

March 30: Rough-winged Swallows at Lako Tangle-Aluminum Aluminum Aluminum. wood (Poggy Acord).

April 6: Eared Grebe(15); Black-crowned Night Don't forget to bring your discarded aluminecked Stilt(1); Barn Swallow(2); Yellow-headed Blackbird(2); Wilson's Phalarope(24); all at Buffalo Lake NWR (KS). Swainson's Hawk; Osprey(1); Ashthroated Flycatcher(1); Chipping Sparrow - all at Lake Tanglewood (PA).

April 13: Snowy Plovor(1); Vosper Sparrow(1); - at Buffalo Lake NWR (KDS,PA).

BIRD NOTES:

Glaucous Gull - a bird in second winter plumage was seen on a playa lake east of Amarillo in Carson Co. 3/14/80 by Rena Ross, Esther Waddill, Mary Moyor, Estelle Duncan, and Vera Deason. It was possibly the same bird seen at Buffalo Lako NWR earlier in the

Red-tailed Hawk: EBggy Acord, Fern Cain and Frank Smith observed one on a nest at Lake Meredith on 3/30.

Long-eared Owl: Ken Sey ffert has found them frequently at Buffalo Lake NWR this spring -2 on 3/9, 2 on 3/23, 6 on 4/6. On one Occation, after the owl had been flushed and had flown further down tho ravine, he squeeked at back to him and the owl lit to within a

few yards of him and remained there until he walked directly up to it. Another one he spied ahead of him as he walked through Rodpoll Cove. The owl compressed its contour feathers until it appeared like a dead limb, and the observer passed within a few yards of it it without flushing the owl. Of the six sonn on 4/6, four of them were flushed from a dense stand of salt cedars. This species can often be found congregated in such habitat during migrati on.

Black-necked Stilt: Peggy Acord and Ken Seyffert saw seven of them at Buffalo Lako NWR on 4/13. Not too many years it was considered a memorable year when this species was seen on the Panhandle; now, we see them every year!

Shorebirds: If you want to learn your shorebirds an reacquaint yourself with old friencs, now is the time to do.itBRffalo Lake will not be with us much longer, but right now the mud flats are extensive and conditions are ideal for shorebirding. Besides those listed above, other species to be seen thero on 4/13 were Long-billed Dowttchers(350-400), Am Avocets(300), Greater Yellowlegs25+), Baird's Sandpiper, Wilson's Phalarope, Loast Sandpipers.
