DR. JOSEPH CEPEDA Dr. Frank Duncan has alorted us to a situation of grave importance. 1113 Colanoso Corporation in Pampa has filed a letter of intent to discharge effluent from their plant into Mhito Door Crook in Carson and Hutchinson Counties. If there is no protest in 30 days, a permit for such discharge will be automatically issued by the Texas Department of Water Resources.

Dr. Copoda has written a letter of protost on bohalf of the Texas Panhandle Audubon Society stating our concorn for the possible contamination, but other letters would help. This must be done as soon as possiblo as the lotter of intent was filed by the Colanese Corporation Fob. 14, 1984. With clean water supplies a grave concorn for not only our area but nation-wido we think it necessary to protost such discharge.

If this drainage is permitted it will contaminate the waters of Mite heer Creek which, in its lower half, is a year-round, spring-fed, running crock, bordered by timber and supporting an extensive aquatic and terréstial wildlife population. In both spring and fall this crock offers a resting place for numerous migrating bird spocios.

Fob. 10 Rona and Georgo Ross found a Whooping Crane in with a flock of Sandhill Cranes north of Kress, Texas. The Rosses alerted local authorities to the birds' presence. Later at Aransas Refuge they were assured the bird was probably from the Aransas flock and not from the Idaho group which winters at Bosque de Apache in New Mexico. This flock usually steps at Alamosa, Cologoing and coming from Idaho.
