### CONSERVATION AWARD:

At the annual Conservation dinner in April, the Conservation Comittee of the Texas Panhandle Audubon Society was happy to confer the 1986 Conservation Award to Mr. F. L. Eicke of Hereford for his outstanding practices in soil and water conservation. Mr. Eicke has been most innovative in his work on terracing and elimination of much irrigation. We all extend our congratulations to Mr. Eicke. Members are invited to begin thinking about a nominee for 1987 and are asked to submit names of condidates to Tommy Rosson, Conservation Chairman.

## PULING ON BUFFALO LAKE REVERSED:

On March 4 the Texas Water Commission reversed its decision of January 8, 1986, denying the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service's application for a permit for Stewart Dike at the Buffalo Lake NWP. In a rehearing the Commission found that Stewart Dike was not detrimental to the public welfare and granted the Service a permit amendment for a five-year term. This is good news as the Texas Panhandle Audubon Society is in support of the Service's plans to keep Buffale Lake as a viable wildlife refuge.

### "GREAT AMARILLO BIRD CHASE":

The first "Great Amarillo Bird Chase" was held April 19 on a raw, windy, and rainy morning. The adverse weather held down, no doubt, the total count, but despite this 67 species were tallied in a four-hour period. The winning team of Seyffert, Scott, Smith and Hilton came up with 50 species. This was followed by Myers, Gomex, and C. & D. Chapman with 43, and Cain, Reynolds, Moyer and Williamson with 40. Elliott and Empie did not turn in their total. The bird-of-the-day was the Black-necked Stilt found first by the Myers party.
