- Dec. 24 (Wednesday) Buffalo Lake NWR: meet at refuge entrance at 8:00 a.m.
- Dec. 27 (Saturday) Lake Meredith(west): meet at National Park headquarters in Fritch at 7:30 a.m.
- Jan. 1 (Thursday) Quitaque (Caprock Canyons): meet at entrance to State Park at 8:00 a.m.
- Jan. 3 (Saturday) Lake Meredith(east): meet at National Park headquarters in Fritch at 7:30 a.m.

RENA ROSS:

The recent and unexpected death of Rena Ross has left all who knew her with a sense of great loss. Rena was a warm friend and a delightful companion with whom we shared many adventures afield in quest of birds. She was a sincerely interested and active member of the TPAS for many years and made one of the finest Presidents we have had. Rena's knowledge of birds was worlwide but none were of greater interest than those she observed in her own yard at 2805 S. Travis. can forget such species as the White-winged Crossbill, Black-chinned Sparrow, Golden-crowned Sparrow, Steller's Jay, Clark's Nutcracker, Pyrrhuloxia, and others I no doubt have omitted. Her place seemed to be a magnet for the unexpected and rare, as though the birds knew their presence there would be noted and appreciated, and she shared these visitors with us all.
Rena, your own presence will be greatly missed. You were warmly human, a gracious lady, and most excellent birders and I know you have now added the Bird of Paradise to your life list.

BIRD NOTES:

- Nov. 9: Solitary Vireo one at Buffalo Lake NWR (KS), a very late record. Only one other record, that of 11/13.
- Nov. 12: Turkey Vulture three at Buffalo Lake NWR (DM) a late sighting.
- Nov. 15: Bald Eagle the arrival date this year, for sure. One in Moore Co. (FC), an immature over Amarillo (PA), two immatures at the Elysian Fields (KS). Pough-legged Hawk twelve at Etter Lake in Moore Co. (FC), an unusually high number.
- Mov. 16: Northern Shrike an adult at Buffalo Lake NWR, harassing a flicker (KS).
- Nov. 19: Oldsquaw a female on the Triangle Ponds east of Tanglewood (DM), a rare visitor to our area, last seen in 1979. Seen later in the day by KS and DW, and again the next day by all three. Seen again 11/29 (KS), 12/1 (PA,DM), 12/4 (DM).
- Nov. 21: Fox Sparrow one in the Palo Duro Canyon SP (KS).
- Nov. 22: Northern Shrike an immature at Buffalo Lake NWR (DM).
- Nov. 27: A female Hooded Merganser and male Rusty Blackbird at Buffalo Lake NWR (KS).
- Dec. 4: Greater White-fronted Goose one at the Elysian Fields (DM).
- Dec. 6: Bonaparte's Gull four at the Elysian Fields (KS).

HIGH COUNTS:

In the annual Christmas Count issue of American Birds a summary of highest counts of individuals for Canada and the United States is published. In all of last year's CBC's, our area produced two of the highest, 207 Wild Turkeys at Lake Meredith(west) and 2265 McCown's Longspurs at Buffalo Lake. We have had the high count before on the turkeys at Lake Meredith and we usually produce the high count on longspurs. One year, I can remember, we produced the high count of Mountain Bluebirds on the Amarillo count. This year a summary of all-time highest counts of individuals was published in American Birds. Sure enough, theall-time highest count for the McCown's Longspur were the 2720 tallied at Buffalo Lake in 1983. Incidentally, the all-time high count for the Lesser Prairie Chicken were the 443 we recorded at Arnett, OK in 1967. We thought it would be of interest to publish a list of all-time highest counts for the Texas Panhandle only:
